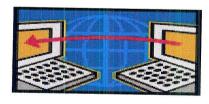

It is hard to believe that it is already May. Soon the weather will be warm and everyone will be having a good time at the outdoor pool. Here is a reminder of the pool rules that everyone must follow.

- No more than four (4) guests at any one time are allowed per dwelling unit unless prior permission has been granted by the Property Manager.
- Children under 17 years of age must be accompanied and supervised by an adult resident.
- No non-toilet-trained children are allowed in the pools or spa.
   No diapers or special garments made for non-toilet-trained children are allowed.
- All persons are required to take a shower before entering the pools and spa.
- Glass or other material that might create hazardous conditions or interfere with efficient operation of pools or spa shall not be permitted in pools or spa.
- No rafts or large pool toys are permitted in pool area.
- Noodles and personal-sized flotation devices are allowed.
- No diving, running or boisterous play is permitted.
- No food, alcoholic beverages or glass shall be permitted in pools, spa or sundeck area.
- Radios, tape players, etc. are permitted on outside decks and exercise room with headphones only, so as not to disturb others.
- No smoking is permitted in the pool and spa areas or anywhere in the Clubhouse.



- In pool and spa areas, only water and non-alcoholic beverages are allowed and must be in plastic sports bottles or plastic cups.
- Pool chairs cannot be reserved or held with your towel.
- At no time may guests use the clubhouse and recreational facilities without being accompanied by and in the presence of their resident host.

# Maintenance Tips

- Change your furnace filters every three months.
- Check the caulk in your bathroom. Caulk will deteriorate after time and needs to be replaced. If this is not watched carefully you could leak into your neighbors unit and cause damage which you would be responsible to repair.
- Water leaking from around the base of your faucets could mean the cartridge needs to be replaced.
- There are small bumpers in the door frame of your front door. If these are missing the door will slam and you will hear a rattle when the door is closed and air is circulating in the hall.
- Change your battery about every 3 years in your garage door opener. Cold weather will

- weaken the battery.
- Patio doors may need to be adjusted from time to time to keep a tight seal. If your patio doors are hard to open and close you can spray them with a little silicone in the track and that should help. In some cases you may have to replace the wheels.
- The life span of smoke detectors is approximately 10 years. If your smoke detector starts to beep and you change the battery and it continues to beep, you will have to replace the smoke detector. The replacement is FireX ACDC and can be found at Home Depot. When you replace your smoke detector consider getting the one with the carbon monoxide detector included. A law was passed in 2008 that all homes must have a carbon monoxide detector.



- Toilets can be leaking/running and you won't even know. Every so often place a drop of food coloring into the tank when you go to bed. When you get up in the morning check the toilet bowl and if the color is there you then know that you must replace some parts in your toilet tank.
- In the bottom of your window tracks you have weep holes. The purpose of these weep holes is to allow rain water to flow out of the window track. If these are clogged the water can seep into your home or your neighbors causing damage and possible mold. Another area for water penetration is where the vertical and horizontal window frames meet. The caulk also deteriorates there and needs to be removed and replaced from time to time. If you do not maintain the weep holes and corners of your window and water leaks into your neighbors home you will be responsible for the repairs in their unit.

#### Condo Corner

- When driving in the condo garages the speed limit is 5 miles per hour.
- The person entering the condo garage has the right of way.
   They cannot back up into the road to allow someone to leave the garage. It is too dangerous.
- When entering the garage, if you see the garage door is open, please wait till the door closes, then press your opener and enter the garage. If you try to enter the garage with out pressing your opener the door could close and damage your vehicle.
- The garage door clearance is 6'6".

#### PERSONAL PROPERTY

As we walk through the Condo buildings we will see some very nice door mats, welcome signs on doors, plants, statues and lots of shoes. In the garages you will find windshield wiper fluid, personal shopping carts and other personal items. Per the Coromandel Condominium Declarations & By-Laws personal property is not permitted in any of the common areas. Please remove your items from all common areas.

• If you have a trash chute room on your floor please make sure to place all of your trash in a secured plastic bag before you throw it down the chute.

Some residents throw un-

wrapped food down the chute which will attract mice and an assortment of bugs. All recycling should be disposed of in the cans provided in the garage level.

The garage parking is <u>ONLY</u> for residents of the buildings, Your friends or contractors cannot use another owners space without permission. Each parking space in the garage is owned and is exclusive use to that owner. No one can park in a garage space unless you have permission from the owner. Only residents can rent spaces in the garage. The Board, at their discretion, will tow unauthorized cars found in the garage without notice.

If you feed squirrels they may become very aggressive and tear your screens.

There are coyotes in the neighborhood so please keep your pets on a leash and never let your pets out on their own. This is against the Coromandel Rules & Regulations, but more importantly it could cost your pet its life.









#### TOWNHOME TALK:

Any Townhome owner with a basement has sump pumps. These pump (s) and the pit (s) should be cleaned out annually by a professional plumber.



Garbage and recycling blowing around is really causing a problem throughout the property. Please prepare your recyclables so that they are secured from the wind. Overflowing bins and bags cause most of the wind blown litter problems. All garbage cans must be kept in the garage at all times.

Also, please remember the rules state

that all rubbish must be kept in sealed containers. Containers should not be placed at the curb any earlier than sunset on the day prior to pickup.

When you go away on vacation please remember to turn your main water supply valve off. In winter pipes can freeze and even in summer a water supply pipe or hose to your wash machine can break, and this will cause a great deal of water damage to your home.



As you walk around you will find dog droppings throughout Coromandel. Some are even left on the sidewalks. This is very unsightly and unpleasant for your neighbors and embarrassment for residents guests. The Coromandel Rules & Regulations require all owners to immediately pick up after their pets.

Another unacceptable item we find in and under the snow are hundreds of cigarette butts all over the grounds and by the front entrances of the condo buildings. Please dispose of your used smoking material properly.

Please take pride in the appearance of your community and help us keep Coromandel the 5 star community of the North Shore that it is known to be.

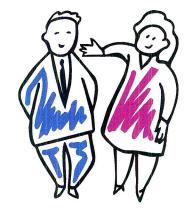
